## Bath planning isn't rocket science, but it does take some homework before you start.

### Determine the look you want to achieve

Whether it is Traditional or Contemporary or something in between, Timeless Baths at Curtis Lumber has more than enough style and color choices to please even the most discerning tastes. With almost limitless options for your bathroom project, it is important to narrow in on the looks, functions, and layouts that appeal to you. ### **Determine your budget**

The designers at Timeless Baths can help you with this process. Be honest with them about your budget expectations. Vanities, whirlpools and floor coverings come in a variety of price ranges. Any bath design can be quoted at various price ranges. Some changes may be required, but the basic design can usually be achieved.

Do some research on your own to help complete the total budget picture. Price showers and tubs, lighting and flooring, ask friends who have remodeled about the costs and read magazines to help you mentally prepare a budget that is realistic.

### **Determine fixtures and add-ons**

Bathroom fixture selection plays a key role in the overall design and look of your new room. Determine what type of fixtures you want in your bathroom. Whirlpools, showers with seats, and laundry cabinets all will impact your design. The styles and varieties of fixtures have grown tremendously in recent years and have become showpieces in bathroom design. Shop your local Curtis Lumber to narrow down your selection.

### Make a list of the things you like and dislike about your current bathroom


### **Consider your timeline**

The process of creating a new bathroom is a major endeavor. Your designer needs to know up front when you plan to complete your project. Some timelines to take into consideration: Your designer may need 1-2 weeks to create your preliminary design, vanities can take from 2-8 weeks from order to arrival, and installation can take an additional 2-6 weeks from the time everything arrives at your jobsite.

# **Bath Measuring Guide**



Measuring your bathroom is easy. By following these simple instructions and using the graph paper provided you can help speed along the design process for your new bath. Simply follow these instructions:

- 1. Start in one corner (A) and measure to the edge of the first door or window and mark down this measurement.
- 2. Measure the door or window (B) from one outside edge of the trim to the other outside edge.
- 3. Now, measure from the outside of the trim to the corner (C) or next door or window.
- 4. Repeat Step 1 through Step 3 until you have measured the entire room.

Please Note: Double check your measurements by measuring the entire wall length from wall to wall and comparing it to your individual measurements taken in Steps 1-3.

### Example:

Steps

(A) to (C): Entire wall measures 144"

From (A) to (B) = 49-1/2". (B) = 45". (B) to (C) = 49-1/2"

Totals: 49-1/2" + 45" + 49-1/2" = 144"
